



Addressing the challenges of plastic waste management and the initiatives taken by our industry partners in resolving them.

INTENT:

- To devise a plan with the Urban local bodies (ULBs) to work with their collection and segregation workers in order to improve the dustbins, MLP picking rod, benches of municipal parks, etc. the waste collectors to be informed and trained about safe waste management protocols and right methodologies of waste segregation in their respective regional languages for better understanding.
- The overall intension of this IEC activity by WeCare concentrated on providing information and creating awareness among the waste collectors, consumers, residential groups, etc; through different social media platforms, outreach programs, seminars, workshops, etc.
- The aim of this activity was to make people aware the need of segregation of plastic waste is more important and beneficial compared to banning of it, and to feed the idea of turning plastic waste into resource and using it for enhancing the economy.
